The Hilton Precinct Gardens, Verge and Trees Subcommittee (GVT) is a community based group run by and for the residents of Hilton to preserve and uphold Hilton's Garden Suburb heritage.

We value our garden history and aim to protect and increase the area of sustainable native trees and plants in our precinct for the benefit and amenity of wildlife and for the education and enjoyment of current and future residents.

Subcommittee Actions to Date

- Promoting Fremantle subsidised plants through posters.
- Busy bee activities around Hilton verges.
- Awareness campaign for polyphagous shot hole borer; 2,500 leaflets distributed.
- Mapping verges with development and surveying residents; 55 responses.
- Applying for grant money for verge excavation and soil removal.
- 3,500 tube stock from Valley Verges distributed to Hilton residents.
- One unsuccessful, awaiting another, and preparing a third for verge projects.

On-going Activities

- Reducing second-generation rat baits, successful outreach to businesses.
- Educating about bait-free processes and regular updates on Hilton Hub (1,000+ members).

Housing Authority and Revegetation
 Discussing impact of Housing Authority on local trees, suggesting partnerships for micro forests and converting sumps.

• Social & Cultural Sub-Committee

- Community Garage Sale: Successful event on September 7th with 33 participants, positive feedback, and future plans to make it annual. Local businesses like Mumma Bee's saw record sales.
- Pizza Night: Held on September 14th, featuring live bands and fire pits. Raised approximately \$1,200 from pizza sales and \$1,000 from mulled wine.
- Book Club: Meets every last Monday of the month at 7:00 PM. Initially attracted 25 attendees; now selects two books per session, maintaining a group size of 6-10 for discussions.
- Hilton Games Night: Held fortnightly on Thursdays, flexible on the day.
 Needs a new organiser due to current lead's commitments. Participants bring and teach various games, usually lasting from 8 PM to 10 PM.

Upcoming Events & Initiatives

- Hiltonween Pumpkin Carving: October 27th from 2:00 to 4:00 PM, one-on-one adult-to-child ratio required.
- Hilton Trick or Treat Trail: October 31st, starts at 4:00 PM with a spooky fairy kickstarting the trail. Costume competition with \$50, \$100, and \$200 gift cards, photo booth by Curtain and Co, and a Google Maps-based virtual map for houses giving candy. Mumma Bee will be open, selling Taco's
- Upcoming Movie Nights: Halloween movie night on October 20th and a Christmas movie night on December 7 at PCYC Progress Hall. Previous movie night had mixed results with lessons learned.
- Post-Halloween Cleanup: Campaign to encourage residents to pick up rubbish the day after Halloween, focusing on education and community responsibility.

• Streets Alive Update

The Hilton Precinct has received a \$5,000 grant from Streets Alive to implement traffic calming measures on Oldham Crescent, between Grigg Street and Lynch Place. We are grateful to the Fremantle Rotary Club for acting as our auspice to receive this grant and would like to formally acknowledge and thank them for their support.

This location was selected earlier this year during a Hilton Precinct meeting, following community discussions. Grigg Park, a popular spot for children, dogs, and other vulnerable users, is adjacent to a bus route and situated at the bottom of two small hills, making it a priority for traffic calming.

The grant will be used to create artwork on the footpath along Oldham Crescent. Additionally, Hilton Precinct has outlined a strategic approach with short, mid, and long-term goals:

Short Term Goal:

- Implement the footpath artwork.
- Host a Community Engagement & Awareness Event with the City of Fremantle in March 2025, including the launch of the Safer Streets Policy.
- Install Happy/Sad face signage to alert drivers exceeding the speed limit and collect data for future discussions with Main Roads and PTA.

Mid Term Goal:

Rewild verges in the area and throughout Hilton by planting native vegetation in line with the City of Fremantle Verge Policy. This initiative, coordinated with the Hilton Precinct's GVT subcommittee, has been shown to reduce driving speeds.

Long Term Goal:

Low Cost Urban Road Safety Program

Art Contribution from Coles

 Coles' new building contributed \$96,000 for art, with potential locations identified. An Expression of Interest (EOI) will be issued soon.
